1 INTRODUCTION

RELEARN FOUNDATION (RELF), established as a charitable trust in 2015 under the Indian Trusts Act of 1882 (No: 755/160), is dedicated to working in the domains of **Education**, **Environment**, and **Empowerment**, with a specific focus on implementing Sahaaj Pathshalas. In the realm of Education, the foundation aims to:

- 1. **Create Free Community-Based Classrooms:** These classrooms are designed to serve disadvantaged populations, providing them with accessible and quality education.
- Remove Social and Digital Divide: The foundation strives to bridge gaps in society and technology access, ensuring equal opportunities for all individuals, regardless of their socioeconomic status.
- Promote Grassroot Innovations and Women Entrepreneurship: By supporting local innovations and encouraging female entrepreneurs, the foundation aims to stimulate economic growth and empower women.
- 4. **Popularize Science and Technology Among Common Masses:** The goal is to make science and technology more approachable and understandable for the general public, fostering a culture of curiosity and innovation.
- 5. **Offer Skill Training for Enhancing Employability:** Through various skill development programs, the foundation seeks to improve the employability of individuals, equipping them with the necessary tools to succeed in the job market.

The Relearn Foundation's comprehensive approach in these areas reflect its commitment to fostering inclusive growth and sustainable development. We envision a world where every individual, regardless of their background, has the opportunity to harness the power of science, technology, and innovation to become a capable and empowered member of society. We believe that by investing in human potential and fostering a culture of creativity, curiosity, and critical thinking, we can create a brighter, more equitable future for all. We have registered under NGO darpan. Our organization has 80G, 12B certification along with FCRA.

Our primary activity is to create and maintain a network of community classrooms called "Sahaaj Pathshala". Sahaaj Pathshalas started in the year 2010 as Digital Literacy Mission to provide quality functional literacy to children from underprivileged families free of cost. Our stakeholders are the students, the tutors, facilitators, the members, the working committee and the governing body. Our Pathshalas are located in three states of Jharkhand, Bihar and West Bengal. There are currently 1015 students receiving education through our efforts. There are 38 classrooms, and 42 teachers who are working with RELF to deliver quality education.

In FY 2023-2024, we started working on children's nutrition in addition to Sahaaj Pathshalas by providing students nutritious snacks of sprouted chana and jaggery to each student when they come for their classes. This is a new undertaking which is still being implemented. We are deeply grateful to our benefactors and beneficiaries for trusting us and our team of volunteers, trainees and employers who contribute selflessly to our mission.





5 EDUCATION

5.1 Sahaaj Pathshala

Relearn Foundation has been working to establish community classrooms in Eastern India under the flagship Digital Literacy Mission (DLM) which has been renamed as Sahaaj Pathshala in 2023. Under the tutelage of women tutors, we establish classrooms in rural as well as urban slum areas. These classrooms are set either in the teachers' homes or in any public space as available. With the help of collaborations with organizations such as **Bodhodoy**, a NGO of West Bengal, which works to empower tribal communities and **SEEDS**, a NGO of Jharkhand, who work to bring socio-economic development to marginalized societies as well as with individual members, we offer education service to needy students located in Jharkhand, West Bengal and Bihar.

These centers are focused on curbing problems such as school absenteeism, malnourishment and drop out. One of the key reasons why students drop out or lose interest in education is because they lack the educational support at home. Or they have additional responsibilities like taking care of their siblings, doing household chores, earning petty amounts by doing manual labour at shops.. These classrooms give the students support to catch up on their studies. The teachers in these classrooms mentor the students through all aspects of life alongside academics, such as health, prevent early marriage, ensure that the children are not getting exploited through child labour. They coordinate with the families of the



students to ensure the best course of action for the students. The teachers act as community mothers to help guide their students to adulthood. Our role as an organization is to support these community mothers, leaders in their endeavors by providing them with skills such as English speaking and writing, creative methods of teaching, taking scientific approach in thinking and gaining skills for earning livelihood for future.

In the FY 2023-2024, our foundation has created 38 community classrooms for underprivileged students. We are providing academic assistance and nutritional food to 1015 students. Through this mechanism we ensure that students do not drop out and are afforded a childhood of fun, games and learning. Our project has been possible due to the collective efforts of our Sahaaj Pathshala team. Illustration 2 is the organizational network of Sahaaj Pathshala Facilitators, Tutors and students. Illustration 3 presents the activities and workflow diagram of Sahaaj Pathshala.




Illustration 2: Sahaaj Pathshalas: Organizational Network of Facilitators, Tutors and Students




Illustration 3: Sahaaj Pathshalas: Activities and Workflow diagram



We also offer training for admission to Navodaya Vidyalaya and other Government residential schools.

5.2 Tutorship Training

The Tutorship Training Program was initiated by the Relearn Foundation during the Pandemic time in 2020. This online tutorship training is held every Friday from 4:30 PM to 6 PM and all tutors of Sahaaj Pathshalas are invited to attend this online session. We have carried on with this program as it is a comprehensive initiative aimed at enhancing the teaching capacity of tutors while also fostering a conducive learning environment for students.

The key components and benefits of the program are presented below:

- **Capacity Building for Tutors:** The program focuses on equipping tutors with the necessary skills and techniques through training sessions conducted every Friday.
- **Interactive Learning Process:** Tutors are encouraged to incorporate fun and games into their teaching methods, fostering better interaction.
- **Empowering Women:** We empower women by providing them with teaching skills and opportunities for financial independence.

- **Utilization of Technology:** Provision of electronic gadgets enables tutors to enhance the quality of teaching and monitor class progress effectively.
- **Evaluation and Recognition:** Tutors are evaluated based on various parameters such as attendance, punctuality, quality of teaching assignments, and student engagement.
- **Monitoring and Support:** The program enables continuous monitoring of student attendance in each of the classrooms and performance to prevent dropouts and ensure a minimum level of education.
- **Focus on Holistic Development:** Incorporating fun games into learning fosters sociopsychological development in students by promoting our core values.

The trainers of the Tutorship Training are members and employees of Relearn Foundation. Ms. Riya Majumdar, Administrative Assistant, offers administrative support to create session links, smooth streaming of sessions, attendance data maintenance, etc., Ms. Madhumita Banarjee, Part-time administrative assistant, helps in the interaction with the tutors.




Illustration 6: Online Friday Tutorship Classes

5.3 Sahaaj Poshan

Our organization primarily focuses on providing academic assistance however one of the problems which we have noted is that some of our students are malnourished. In FY 2023-2024 we initiated the program Sahaaj Poshan to give nutritious snacks of sprouted chickpea with jaggery to our students when they come to our classroom for their studies. This was made possible with the generous contribution of ITD Cementation India Limited. The nutritional

contents of Chana-Gur are many such as proteins, vitamin B6, zinc, carbohydrates, etc. The most important reason for choosing this was the wide availability and affordability. In the flyer given below, we have given a step-by-step process of preparing the sprouted Chana. Currently, 38 RELF classrooms across 3 states of Jharkhand, West Bengal and Bihar receive and distribute sprouted Chana-Gurr. A total of 1015 students receive this healthy snack. We have provided weight and height measurement devices to calculate the BMI every month.

Our program aims eradicate to malnutrition by providing nutritious food to students in 38 classrooms of Sahaai Pathshala. We seek to enhance children's development physical and malnutrition through awareness training. Key indicators monitored will include Stunting (height-for-age), Wasting (weight-for-height), Overweight (weight-for-height) and Underweight (weight-for-age) based on WHO standards.

With the encouragement of our chairperson Prof. Prabal Kumar Sen, launched the Sahaaj Poshan initiative in April 2023 by providing sprouted chana-gur to students daily in one Sahaaj Pathshala classroom in Vijaya Garden. We submitted a proposal titled "Digital Sahaaj Pathshala with Sahaaj Poshan" to ITD Cementation Pvt. Ltd., which resulted in a CSR grant of 15 lakhs. In February 2024 we extended the program to all classes across three states and provided monitoring devices such as weighing machines and height-measuring equipment to the classrooms. As of May 2024, we are still in the implementation stage, processing data, and planning to train our teachers to record and share data responsibly and correctly.

Our program aims to eradicate malnutrition by providing nutritious food to students in 38 classrooms of Sahaaj Pathshala. We seek to enhance children's physical development and fight malnutrition through awareness and training. Key indicators monitored will include Stunting (height-for-age), Wasting (weight-for-height), Overweight (weight-for-height), and Underweight (weight-for-age) based on WHO standards.

6 ENVIRONMENT

6.1 Gardening and Composting

Our organization works with education and part of that education is also to raise awareness about plants such as algae, moss, and ferns that are flowerless and the flowering plants and trees. We work with our students to help them connect with plants which is an extracurricular activity or a hobby.

Waste produced in domestic kitchens that might have otherwise ended up in landfills may be of great use when it is converted into compost. Home composting is one of the most sustainable ways of organic waste management. The foundation endeavors towards the sustained production of compost from kitchen waste and has been able to make significant progress in this regard by offering training to students of local schools.

The foundation developed an earthen composter using locally available earthen pots and promoted its usage amongst its beneficiaries. Ms Rakhi Mitra, a member of Relearn Foundation, is a proud owner of such a composter. She said, "I am happy to do the composting and am using the compost for my plants."

6.2 Single-Use Plastic Management Application

The "Single-Use Plastic Management" mobile application, developed by Relearn Foundation interns Manpreet Singh, Namrata Raj, and Dr. Mita Tarafder, aims to combat single-use plastic pollution. Users play a crucial role in categorizing and managing single-use plastics through the app's user-friendly interface.

Plastic banks, established in schools, colleges, and institutions, serve as collection points, feeding into plastic corridors managed in collaboration with NGOs, facilitating transportation to plastic recyclers. These recyclers, in turn, transform plastics into granules for reuse. Finally, partnerships with plastic destroyers, such as steel and cement industries, ensure proper incineration of plastic granules, reducing carbon footprints.

Ultimately, this initiative will eliminate single-use plastics while promoting sustainable waste management, job creation, and female entrepreneurship.




Illustration 10: Single-Use Plastic Management Flyer

6.4 Upcycling & Reusing of Waste Clothes

One of the most significant advantages of upcycling waste clothes is its positive impact on the environment. Traditional disposal methods for textile waste, such as incineration and landfilling, release harmful pollutants and greenhouse gasses. By diverting clothing from landfills, upcycling reduces these emissions and decreases the burden on waste management systems. Furthermore, upcycling conserves natural resources by minimizing the need for raw materials. The production of new textiles often involves significant water usage and chemical treatments, which upcycling can circumvent, thereby preserving vital ecosystems and reducing pollution.

Relearn Foundation initiated the "Upcycling & reusing of waste cloths" activities through the process of collection and distribution of waste cloths in the local community. The waste cloths collected are sorted and then the usable clothes are displayed for service providers to take by paying small donations. 7.3 Employment Opportunity Creation

This innovative model of Sahaaj Pathshala not only empowers individuals to upskill themselves but also ensures that they are gaining practical experience and expertise through meaningful engagement in teaching underprivileged students and earning monthly honorarium for spending 10-15 hours per week. Relearn has created employment opportunities for more than 40 female tutors. In addition, employees of the NGO, Namrata Raj, Pritha Dhali, Swati Chatterjee, Laxmi Mukhi, Mahesh Parmanik, Riya Mazumdar, and Dipak Dhibar, individuals who have seized the chance to enhance their skills while contributing to the mission of the NGO. Through this symbiotic relationship between training and employment, Relearn Foundation is not only equipping individuals with valuable skills but also fostering sustainable development within the community.

7.4 Student Support and Girls Hostel Facilities

Relearn Foundation is dedicated to providing comprehensive support to students, exemplified by its commitment to two girls who were the students of Digital Literacy Mission (DLM): Chandni Kumari and Shivani Yadav. Since 2020, Chandni and Shivani have been staying at the hostel facility provided by the NGO. They are currently studying in colleges; Chandni is studying BSc IT at the Karim City College, Jamshedpur and Shivani is studying BA (Sociology) at East Calcutta Girls College, Kolkata. Donations received from Ms. Baishali Raychoudhury and the parents of Chandni and Shivani are utilized to support the education and girls' hostel facilities at Jamshedpur.

Relearn Foundation ensures that both girls have access to adequate living facilities, including accommodation, food, course fees, and other essentials. Chandni, currently in her third year of BSc (IT) in Jamshedpur, and Shivani, pursuing her second year of BA (Sociology) in Kolkata, receive holistic support that enables them to focus on their academic pursuits without the burden of financial constraints. Through its unwavering support, Relearn Foundation is not only investing in the education of these young women but also empowering them to achieve their full potential and contribute meaningfully to society in the future. It is desired that on gaining financial independence, these girls will support young girls in the future which will create a multiplier effect for uplifting women and girls.

7.5 Udyam Aadhar Registration

In the FY 2023-2024, Relearn Foundation took significant strides in empowering women by assisting Riya Mazumdar in registering herself in Udyam, the government portal for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). Central to our organizational ethos is the provision of an empowering environment for skilled women, recognizing the transformative impact of upskilling on their confidence and sense of accomplishment. As part of our commitment to fostering gender-inclusive economic participation, we have actively conducted skill training initiatives aimed at encouraging more women to engage in MSMEs. Riya Mazumdar is currently employed with us as our data manager while concurrently managing her own enterprise under the mentorship of Dr. Mita Tarafder.

8 PROJECT COMPLETION REPORTS

8.1 Digital Sahaaj Pathshala with Sahaaj Poshan

Sponsored by ITD Cementation Pvt. Ltd, the Relearn Foundation embarked on a mission to provide free education to primary and secondary school students in villages through the "Digital Sahaaj Pathshala with Saahaj Poshan" initiative. The project aimed to address school dropouts and absenteeism while empowering women tutors, known as "community mothers," to mentor and guide students towards completing their secondary education. Creative learning activities, including games, were employed to foster academic motivation among students.

Objectives Achieved:

- 1. Establishment of 25 new Sahaaj Pathshalas.
- 2. Provision of nutritious snacks, Chana Guud (Sahaaj Poshan), to students in all classrooms.
- 3. Organization of online training sessions for tutors of Sahaaj Pathshalas.
- 4. Conducting training programs for livelihood generation and women entrepreneurship.

Project Impacts:

- Reached 1,050 students, engaged 42 tutors, established 39 centers, and set up 53 classrooms, including 25 new ones.
- All tutors and students are from vulnerable and marginalized sections of society.
- Tutorship training sessions were conducted to ensure the delivery of quality education.

Nature camps were organized in select centers to enrich students' learning experiences.

9.3 Seminar on Collaborative Efforts for Clean Air

The seminar on "Collaborative Efforts for Clean Air in Jamshedpur, Jharkhand," held on 12th August 2023, was a pivotal event addressing the hazardous impact of pollution on health, the environment, and quality of life, emphasizing the urgent need for collaborative action. Key discussions included a Sustainable Awareness Drive utilizing "nukkad natak" (street plays) to educate local communities on air pollution, and the development of an Inclusive Action Plan that prioritizes the involvement of women and children through activities like regular health checkups, reducing vehicular emissions, and promoting afforestation. Expert insights from Dr. Nandi offered practical measures to combat pollution, such as monitoring health effects, reducing vehicular usage, and promoting green spaces. The seminar also explored the benefits of aligning local efforts with the National Clean Air Program (NCAP) for access to resources and structured frameworks. The importance of multi-stakeholder collaboration, including local government bodies (Nagar Nigam), NGOs, private sector players, and the government, was underscored to enhance clean air initiatives. Real-time monitoring with AQI machines was

proposed for informed decision-making and timely interventions. The significance of enforcing Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) audits and establishing dedicated legal frameworks was emphasized to ensure accountability and incentivize eco-friendly practices. Public awareness campaigns were highlighted as essential for educating citizens and promoting responsible behavior. The seminar concluded with a vision to establish Jamshedpur as a cleanair hub and role model for other regions, showcasing the potential of collective efforts to create a healthier and more sustainable environment.




Illustration 21: Flyer For Presentation on Energy Literacy to Mitigate Carbon Footprint

10.2 Attendance of students

We maintain a robust database of attendance of students at all our Sahaaj Pathshalas. There are 954 students in 38 Sahaaj Pathshalas located in West Bengal, Jharkhand and Bihar. Each classroom maintains an attendance register in which students' attendances are recorded every day. The table presented below indicates tutors' names, classroom addresses, total number of students enrolled (S), total number of days (TD) the classroom was open, the total students present (TSP), obtained from the attendance register, and finally the f=TSP/TSD, where TSD is the Total Students Days calculated by (S x TD). The fraction, f, signifies the students' interest in attending the classroom. If f is more than 0.7, students like to attend the classroom and if it is less than 0.5, they do not like the classes. When there is more than 1, there may be more students joining the classes in the middle of the month or a wrong entry in the attendance register.

10.3 Attendance of tutors in the tutors' training

Every Friday, we organise online tutors' training to share innovative teaching ideas and teach English, Mathematics and General knowledge to tutors. The attendance of the tutors is maintained. Table in Annexure 5 presents the attendance of tutors in the month of March 2024.
